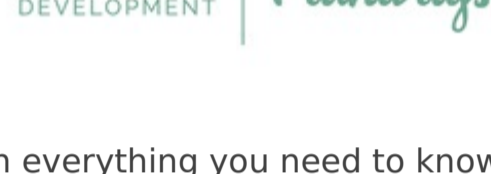

Are You In Palmerston North?

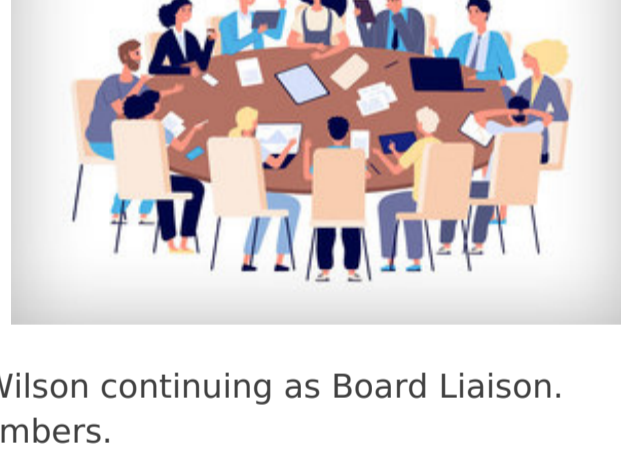

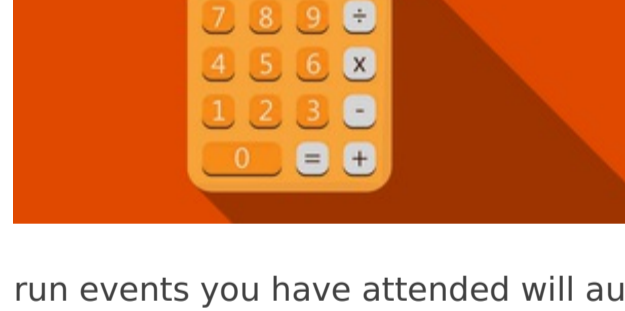
branch up and running in the beautiful Manawatu.
