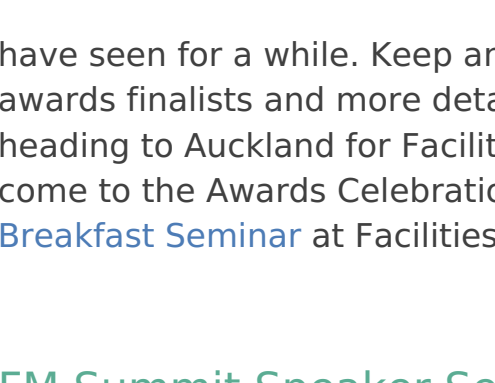

Join Us to Celebrate Excellence in FM

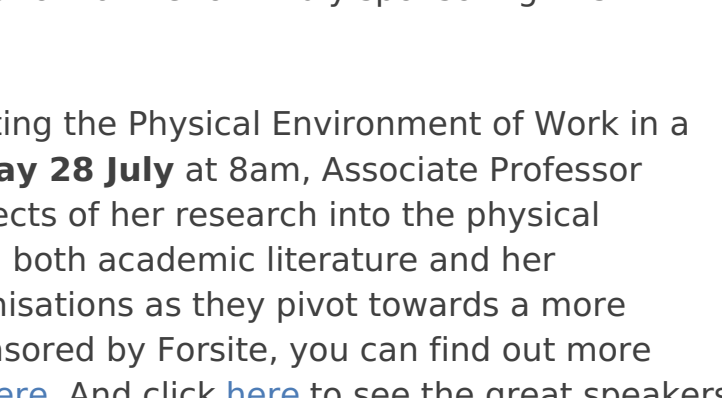

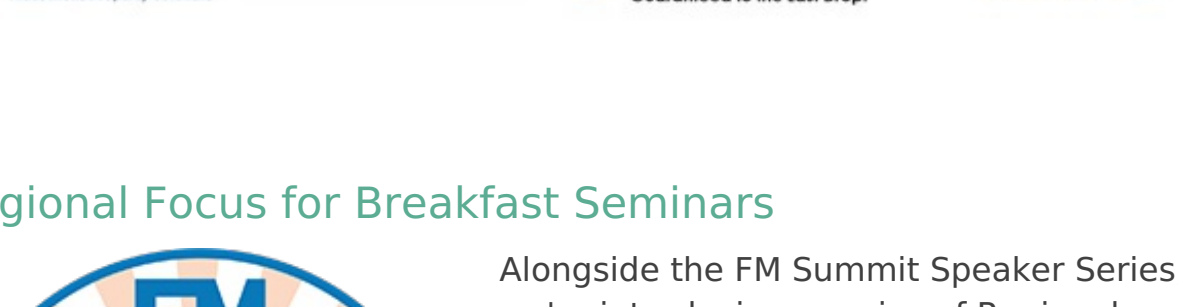

FM Summit Speaker Series - Have You Registered?

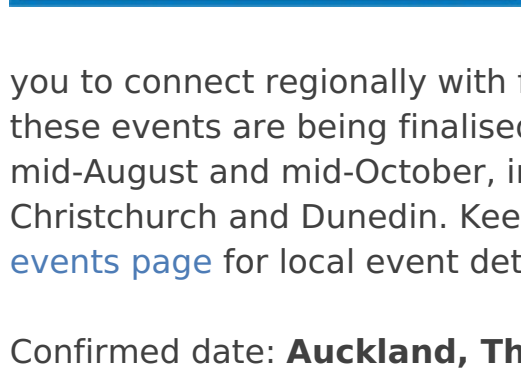

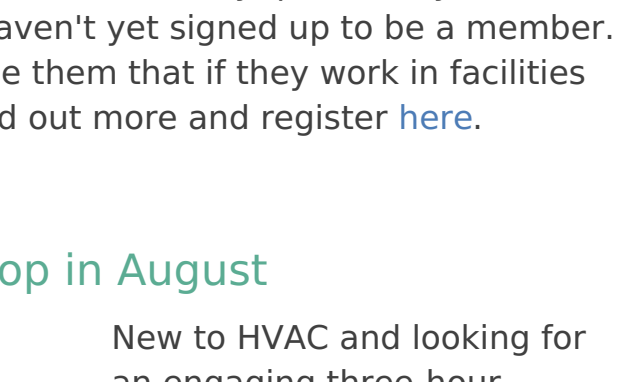
And if all that wasn't enough, here are two more events for your diary:

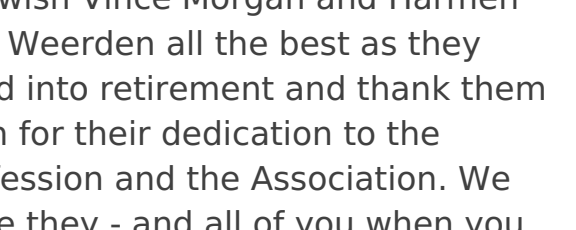

HVAC 101 - An Online Workshop in August



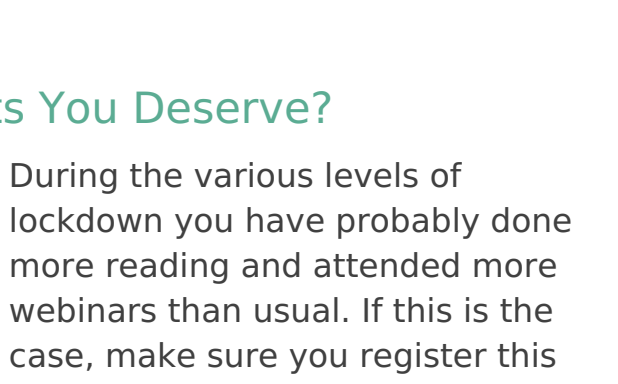
Are you an HVAC and looking for an engaging three-hour session on the basics of heating, ventilation and air conditioning? Join specialist consultant Lance Jimmieson on

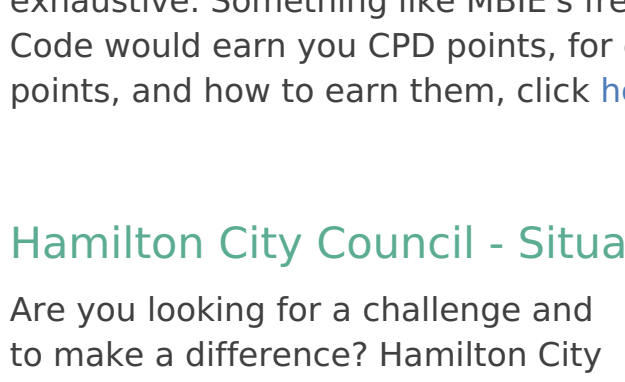

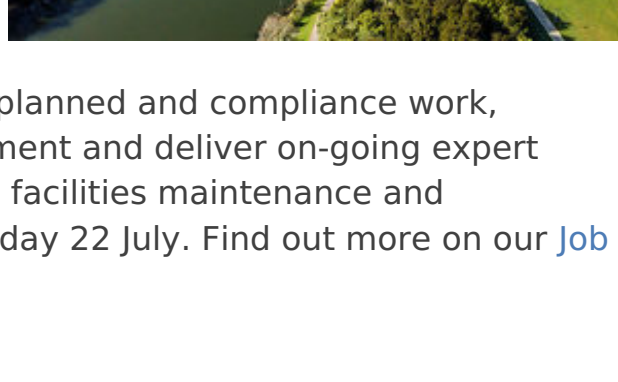
Are You Getting the CPD Points You Deserve?

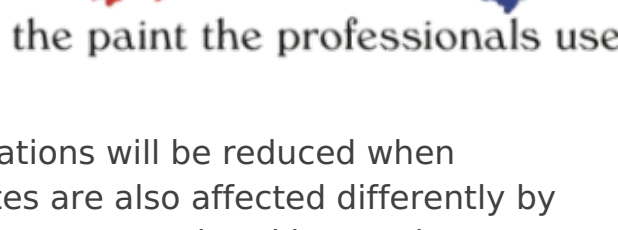
And the Winner Is ...

Paint for NZ Conditions - In New Zealand we have far higher UV exposure levels than most other parts of the world. North-facing elevations are exposed to a much greater level of UV impact than south-facing and therefore the lifespan of paint coatings on north elevations will be reduced when compared to south elevations. Substrates are also affected differently by heat stress with timbers having far higher stress-related issues than concrete or steel. This can have an impact on maintenance requirements of buildings; for example, north-facing timber joinery will require repainting far more often than a south-facing concrete wall.

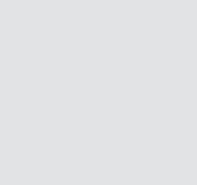
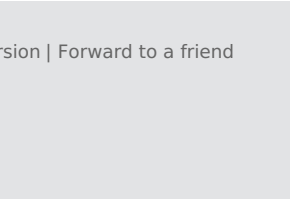
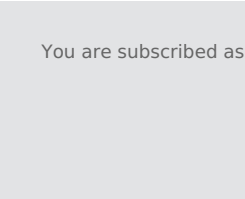
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
