Review of education strategy

We have established a working group to review and update our education strategy, which was developed in 2017. The new education strategy will reflect the progress that has been made in FM professional development over the past five years. The Education Strategy Review Working Group is being led by Education Committee Chair, Ross Brunton CFMANZ, and supported by Rory Chacko CFMANZ, Tracy Massam CFMANZ and Wayne Abel, FMANZ's Professional Development Manager.

TTFMA joint research study

Under the auspices of the Trans-Tasman Facilities Management Alliance, we are working with FMA to scope and commission a joint research study on the economic size and value of FM in New Zealand and Australia. The study will also include research on the growth of the FM industry, workforce projections, employment and skills development.

'Redesigning Design' Workshop

A heartfelt thank you to Mark Sinclair CFMANZ for representing FMANZ at a 'Redesigning Design' workshop hosted by Te Waihangā (New Zealand Infrastructure Commission) and the New Zealand Construction Industry Council last month in Wellington. The aim of the workshop, attended by 40 construction sector professionals, was to bring together key people from across the infrastructure design system to reimagine the way design services are procured and delivered for government infrastructure projects.

The main points for the FM industry were:

- BIM - artificial intelligence will become more important and essential.
- Carbon reduction will become a necessity.
- There is a need for FM to influence the design outcomes for projects.

Mark's attendance at this workshop is a great example of FMANZ increasing its reach in the area of advocacy.

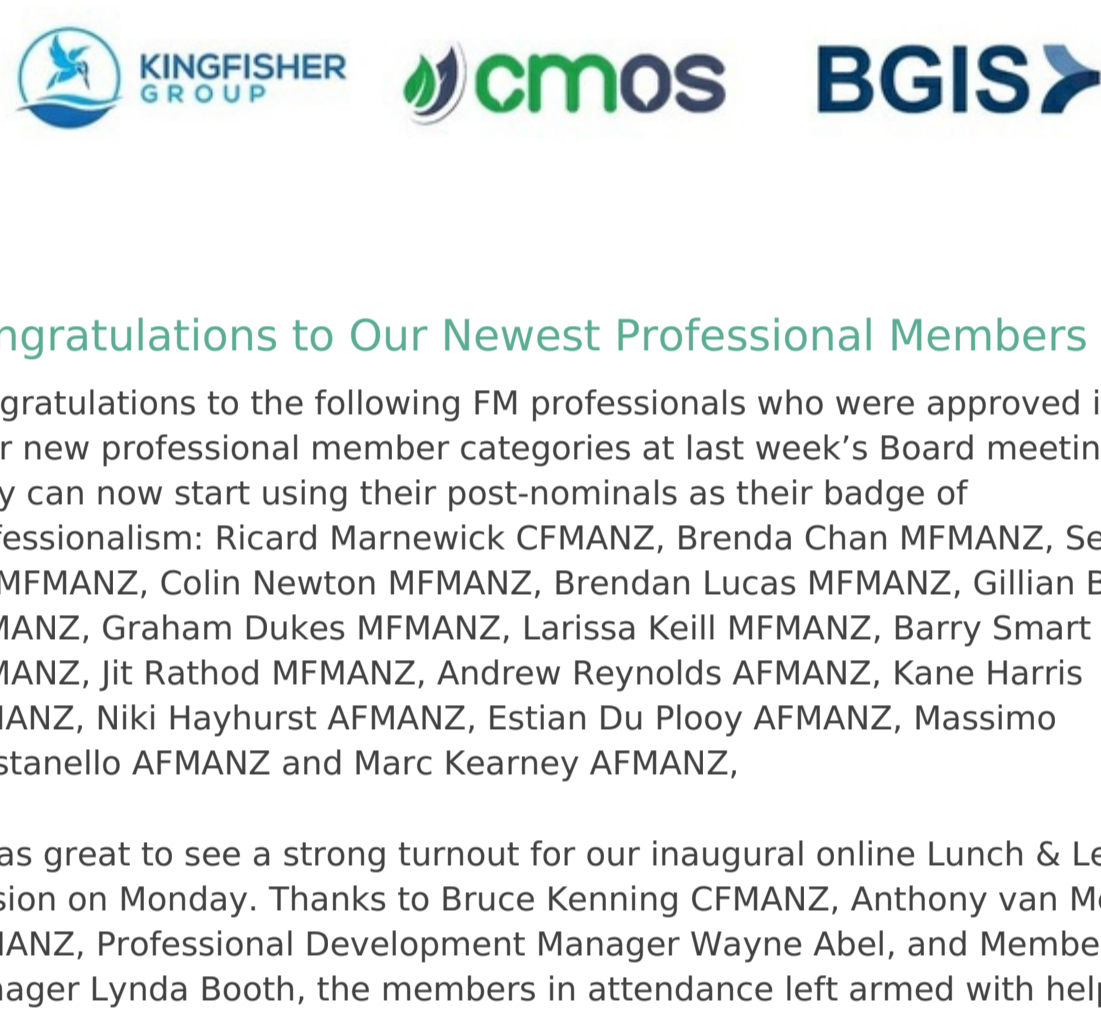

Congratulations to Our Newest Professional Members

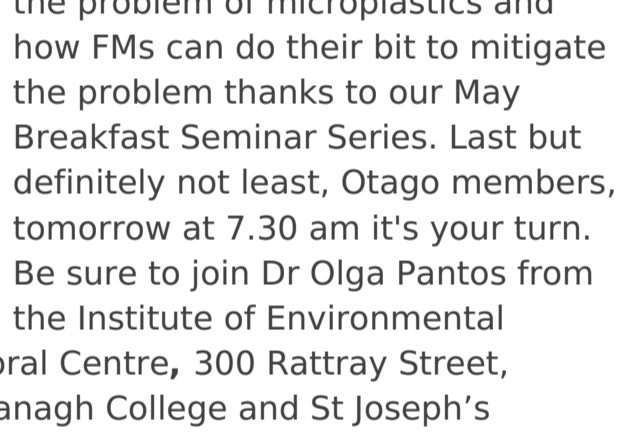

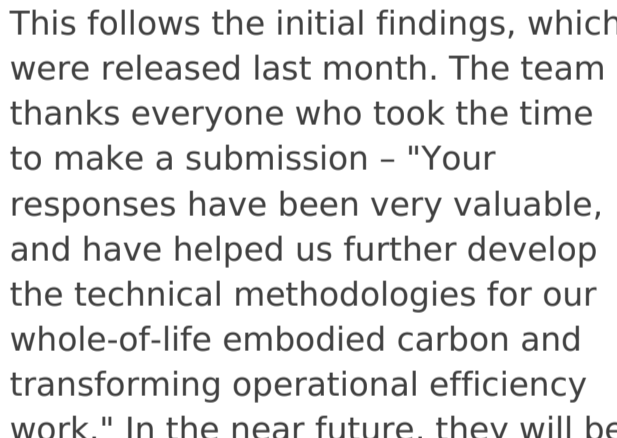


What? A two-and-a-half-hour online workshop consisting of four 30-minute sessions with breakout sessions and discussion.

Building for Climate Change Report Released

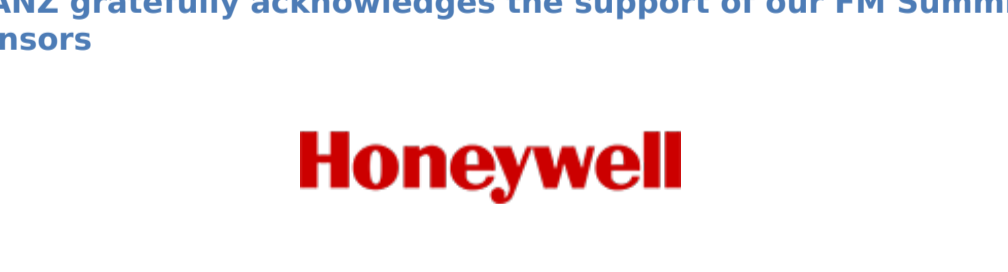
MBIE's Building for Climate Change team has uploaded the full summary of submissions report from the 2020 Building for Climate Change consultation onto their website. [View the report.](#)

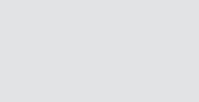
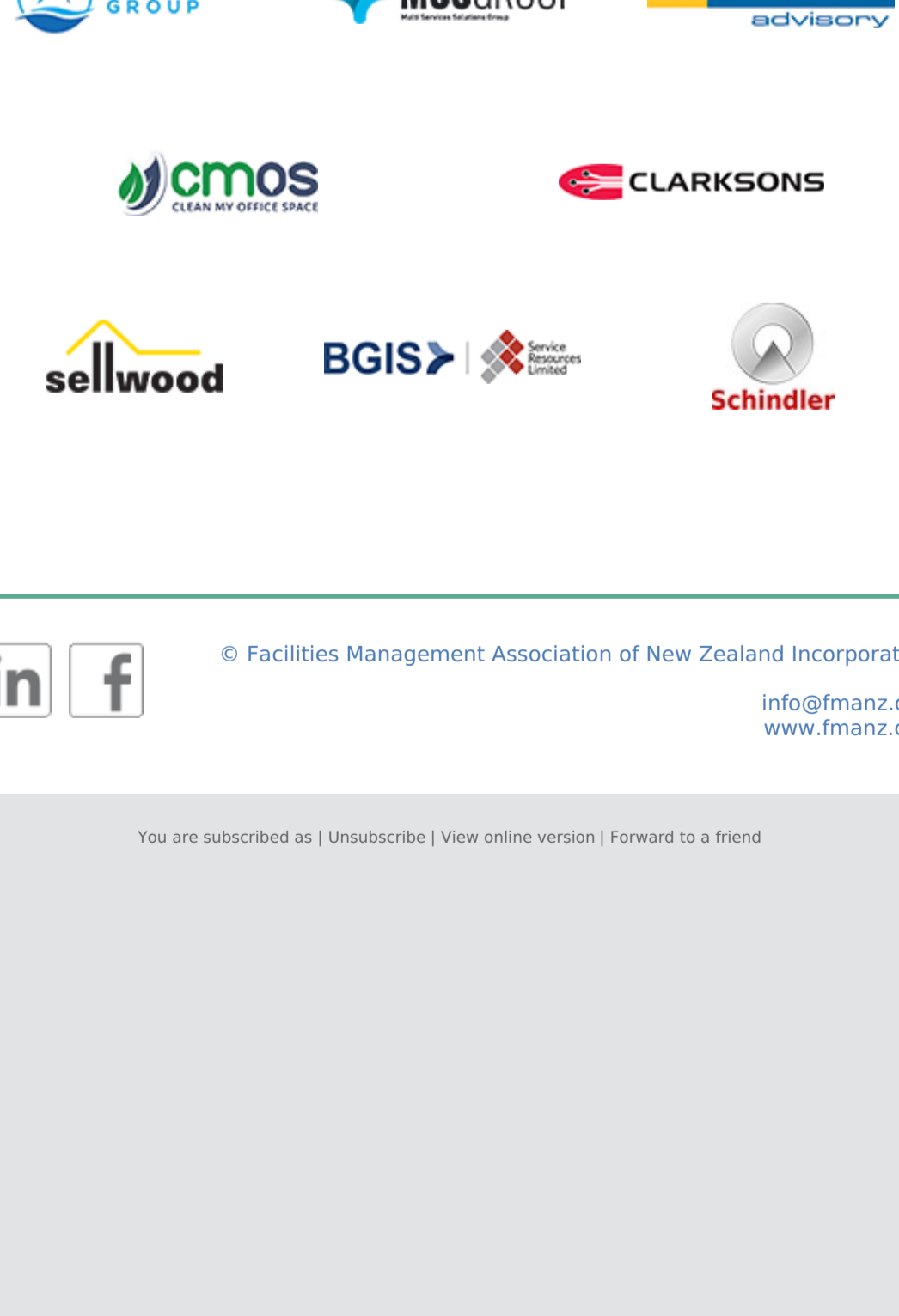
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
