Date for FMANZ AGM Set

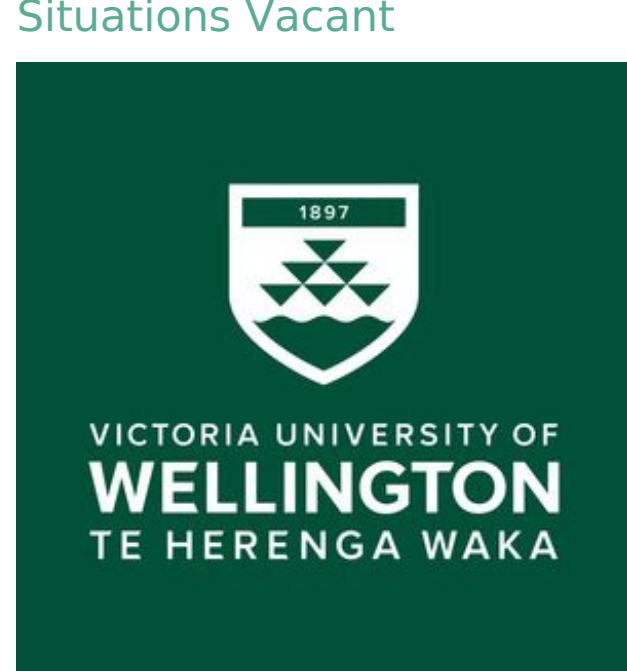

A new Code of Practice has been developed for the integration of Building Fire Safety Systems with other services and the Fire Protection Association invites your feedback. FMANZ gathered a voluntary group of interested organisations and industries together to develop a document to address concerns and issues arising through various stages of design, construction and building use involving integrated
