Waterborne Paints – Waterborne paints were first introduced to the local market in the 1950s mainly to remove lead from decorative paint products. The development of these has continued over decades to the fantastic range we have today which can be used in place of solventborne paints. Painters reap the benefits of easy water washup, lower odour and a fraction of the VOCs of the solventborne products. However, there is still a place for solventborne paints. For example, in cases where we are coating new structural steelwork we would always recommend a 2 Pack Epoxy/Urethane type system to ensure the coating meets the AS/NZS2312 coating guidelines for durability periods in the applicable atmospheric corrosivity zones. Always seek advice from your paint professional who will specify the best possible solution for each substrate and the condition it is in.
